## What is CERT?

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is a program that trains people to prepare and respond to emergency situations in their homes, neighborhood, and community. CERT members are friends, neighbors, and business colleagues that come together as a team to make a difference at an emergency incident by providing **"the greatest amount of good for the greatest number of people."** Members are trained to perform tasks such as first aid, search and rescue, hazard identification, damage assessment, information collection, and much more. After receiving this training, members will have the skills and knowledge to provide critical emergency functions to the community should emergency responders be delayed.

## Where is CERT?

CERT is active in over 30 Florida counties with over 5,000 neighborhood trained personnel.

## Why CERT?

Historical disasters such as hurricanes, tornadoes, flooding, large wildfires, hazardous materials incidents, and terrorist attacks have clearly shown that after a catastrophic disaster, during the initial phases of the incident emergency response agencies are often overwhelmed, short on personnel and resources, and are simply unable to respond right away to provide assistance. Members of the community have often had to wait hours, several days or even longer for assistance; citizens have had to step-up to help themselves and help victims in their immediate neighborhood. Why CERT? Because CERT training gives you the knowledge and skills to prepare, and should an emergency disaster strike, the ability to analyze and immediately act in a safe, efficient, and effective manner to save lives and protect property.
