Treasurer's Report: The May treasurers report was presented. At this time, we are 67% through the budget year, have received 99% of revenues (including cash brought forward) and have spent 70% of expenditures (less reserves). There were no questions. (2)

By Chief Noble-

- Weekly reports and monthly run sheet is attached
- Beginning to speak to groups about the fire fee assessment.
 Working closely with Bayshore. We are also trying to get the News Press to do a fair and unbiased article about the fire fee
- Attended Lee County Fire Chiefs Meeting last week it is a lot of doom and gloom county wide, and we are trying to figure out how to help each other
- Lee County has put the CAD system update on hold, indefinitely. This causes problems because not sure how to replace the sending unit (air card, etc.)
- Meeting with Lee County EMS this week to discuss the expansion and costs of the Trail Dairy Station
- Met with Sawyer Smith today, he is currently seeking a county commissioners seat position and was here to just ask questions about fire districts
- Regarding the Brooks Road Property we have a Development Order in place, civil engineering has been done which would save a buyer money. Realtor from Market America feels the property is worth \$159,000. Chief Noble feels we should look at other realtors. He would like to get at least 3 more proposals from other realtors.

By Asst. Chief Meredith-

 Met with Chief Cochran at Cape Coral Fire about the mutual aid agreement and everything looks good.
 Commissioner Mere asked where does the Cape Coral boundary end behind Home Depot? Chief Meredith responded behind the Children's Science center.

Debbie Ballard was disappointed that there was no union representation at the union conference in Naples, which is only 50 miles away, and does not feel there are any excuses why no one was there.
