Minutes:

Commissioner Ballard made a motion to accept the October 17, 2022 minutes. Seconded by Commissioner Gatewood. Commissioner Ballard stated the October 17, 2022 minutes needed to be corrected. The motion accepting the September 19, 2022 minutes is incorrect because it says Commissioner Mere made the motion and seconded the motion. The minutes need to be corrected to reflect the correct people. The motion was put to vote, and approved by the Board. All were in favor. The vote was 4-0. (1)

Treasurer's Report: The October Treasurer's Report was presented. At this time, we are 9% through the budget year, received 49% of revenues (including carryover) and spent 11% of expenditures (less reserves). There were no questions. (2)

- The shelter population is at 198
- We have been accepting firefighter and fire inspector applications.
- Two members of the honor guard recently attended an academy in Ocala. Commissioner Hoke asked how many were in the Honor Guard? Lieutenant Cameron replied 9.

By Chief Manson –

- Run report attached.
- Classroom, Trail Dairy, Dayroom, and vehicles have all been repaired from damage caused by Hurricane Ian.
- PMI's on Rescues is complete.

- The recent Sutphen invoice is very large. E4 has been in the shop since before the hurricane.
- Talked to Alan Jay about Fords, might need to go to a Dodge.

Commissioner Ballard mentioned if using the state bid list there is a 3–4-week window to be able to order vehicles with just a chassis

Commissioner Gatewood asked how the Dodges were holding up? Good.

Commissioner Hoke asked what the cost difference was between the Ford and the Dodge? Approximately \$5,000.

Commissioner Gatewood asked which box we would use, Reading or Knapheide? Knapheide.

Commissioner Ballard made a motion to allow Administration to proceed to find a new Rescue and Brush Truck and order them, no matter which manufacturer. Seconded by Commissioner Gatewood. The motion was put to vote, and approved by the Board. All were in favor. The vote was 4-0.
